

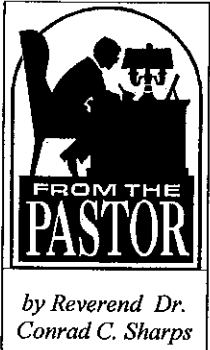

Attitudes Make a Difference

It was a glorious day at the beach with our good friends from Colorado. Their children had never been to the beach and they were having a blast despite water temperatures that would be invigorating for a polar bear. Before you knew it, sandcastles appeared, complete with notes.

I guess it was about the time that one of the sandcastles nearly washed away that the parents gave the children fair warning: "Kids, we'll be leaving in ten minutes."

Almost immediately there was some grumbling until little five-year old Brandon (AKA Spiderman) said, "Wait a minute, ten minutes is a lot more than five... Yeah!"

"Ten minutes is a lot more than five!" What a great attitude to adopt in life. Perhaps this is why Isaiah said, "And a little child shall lead them." (Isaiah 11:6) How important attitudes are in life. Paul, himself writing from prison to the Christians at Philippi, wrote "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus." (Philippians 2:5)

As disciples we should spend time, especially during this season of Lent, examining our attitudes, motivations and desires to be more Christ-like in life, be-

cause attitudes can and do make a difference in our witness. Like little Brandon, we too can choose to be positive in all things — even in the constrictions placed upon us in this life.

As the observance of Lent begins this month, let us reflect upon the life and the attitudes demonstrated by our Lord Jesus Christ. As Paul goes on to write to the Philippians concerning Christ: "Who being in the very nature of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death — even death on a cross! (Philippians 2:6-8)

The attitudes demonstrated by our Lord: humility, servanthood, obedience and sacrifice are hardly the attitudes that one would choose naturally. Ask any rational person living in the world today and they will probably assure you that these attitudes may not guarantee happiness. These attitudes, however, if lived in accordance with the Spirit, will grant us joy as we seek to honor and glorify God as disciples of Jesus Christ. This is the joy of living within the will of God.

Will you examine your attitudes today? How will you change? Will you repent and turn toward God and live a life of renewed joy? Indeed, will you live a life of childlike joy — able to rejoice with only ten minutes remaining?

Job Description

The Sexton functions as the supervisor of all church related ground and building maintenance. General responsibilities of the Sexton include identifying and addressing the maintenance, repair, and cleaning needs of all properties of First Presbyterian Church of Fernandina Beach, FL, and establishing a maintenance schedule to keep the church properties in good repair. This position is responsible for supervising volunteers and contractors to ensure that safe work practices are implemented while on church property. This position reports to the Senior Pastor and is responsible to the Chair of the Property Committee.

- Monitor all expenses and stay within annual budget.
- Work with Property Committee to set priorities for expenditures.
- Work with Property Building Managers to identify issues to be addressed in each building.
- Anticipate equipment replacement.

- Utilize and implement Florida Public Utilities energy survey suggestions to ensure energy efficiency.

LENT

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, comes on February 9, 2005. We Christians observe Lent for 40 days (excluding Sundays) to examine our spiritual condition and to strive to improve our relationship with God. Lent is also a period of spiritual preparation for Easter Sunday, the greatest day on the Christian calendar.

During Lent most churches have additional services. Some offer special Bible study events or classes in strengthening the spiritual life. It is a good time to study the life of a great Christian from the past and the ways that person developed closeness to God.

It's important that each Christian practice spiritual disciplines to "show that you are a letter of Christ ... written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts." (2 Corinthians 3:3, NRSV).

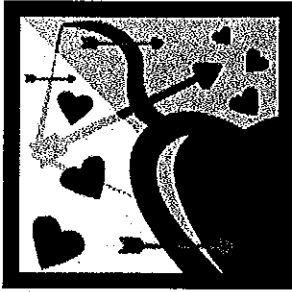

Heroic St. Valentine

We probably think of romance when Valentine's Day comes. That's fine, but there's more to the story than that.

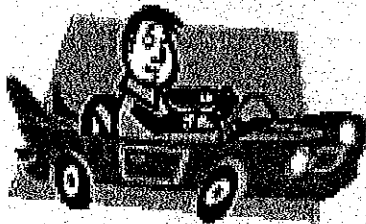
St. Valentine was a Christian priest and martyr who lived about A.D. 270. The Roman emperor at the time was Claudius II. Claudius had been a successful general. He would not allow his soldiers to marry, because he wanted to make sure they could go to battle quickly. He thought family ties would make the men reluctant to leave home.

Because Valentine promoted marriage and family life, he was jailed and later convicted of going against the orders of the emperor. He was martyred on February 14th, the day we remember him and our loved ones. While he was in jail, the jailer's daughter befriended him. He wrote her a letter of appreciation and signed it "Your Valentine." The tradition of exchanging valentines grew out of that heartfelt gesture.
