



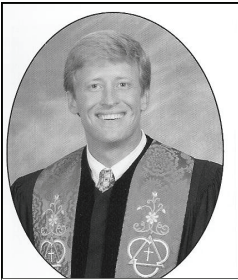

Dear Friends,

Recognizing that you may now have many questions regarding the upcoming interim period, maybe I can clarify some of the potential next steps for our church family.

At the January Session meeting, the Personnel Committee, which consists of Charlotte Bowling, Doc Burgess, Ed Constant, Todd Davis (Chair), and Nelson Showalter, was asked to function as the Interim Pastor Search Committee. At the Session's request, the committee added an additional member, Yvonne Treska, to allow for further representation. The committee has already been given the names of several potential candidates, who will be contacted. The task of locating a qualified Interim Pastor is not normally a lengthy process.

Likely the next step will be that our church's 2011 Nominating Committee, which consists of Trish Booton, Mike Bowling, Linda Johns, Robin Marley, Jack Meeks, Shirley Owens, and Ted Selby, will be called upon to nominate a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Once elected by you the congregation, the PNC will begin the work of searching for the next Head of Staff for our church family.

Their search will be a marvelous journey that will, by God's good grace, culminate in the calling of the person that God has chosen to lead this church into the future. In the near future as the committee is being formed and then as they carry out their work I implore you to have them uppermost in your prayers. I encourage you to remember that such a process of listening and discerning touches the hearts

of both the potential candidate for the position and the members of the committee. The call will be just as pronounced in the life of the one chosen as it has been for me over the last few months. As I recently went through my own call process, one of the joys has been the affirmation in my heart that God did bring me here for us to serve together for such a time as this. I humbly believe that the work God set out for us to do together will enable our church family to take even greater steps into God's future in the years to come.

The last few weeks have been a particular blessing for me. A friend recently shared with me the following statement, "If only we could always be thoroughly, thoughtfully grateful for one another, then the world would be jealous of the church's koinonia." Indeed, your remarkable kindness testifies to the spirit of communion and fellowship that has and will continue to mark our church family.

By the time you receive this letter I will have taken on new and different responsibilities. It will no longer be my place to make recommendations about what should or should not be done during the upcoming interim period or beyond. That said, we will remain with you in Spirit and you will remain in our prayers.

God has, indeed, surrounded our church family with love. May that love continue to mark your life and mine, and may the chapters yet to be written in each of our lives be even better than the ones that have preceded them. My humble prayer is that the Lord will bless and keep us all!

ENRICHMENT SPRING 2011

This year there will be a wide variety of classes and workshops offering everything from spiritual growth to helpful workshops for planning worship and education in your church setting. PM 5: Experience the Saint John's Bible, *Rev. Dr. John Ragsdale*, The Saint John's Bible is the first handwritten, illuminated Bible in 500 years. See the stunning art that accompanies the Word of God in engaging and inspirational ways.

PM 6: Mindfulness for Life, *Dr. Barbara Bishop*, Come sample how living mindfully helps nurture balance of body, mind and spirit.

PM 7: Stewardship, *Rev. Dr. Dwight Bayley*, This class will discuss effective models of stewardship with a primary focus on the Consecration Sunday model.

In Romans 12:13 we are told to share with God's people who are in need, to practice hospitality. As you are probably aware, February 6 is the Football Super Bowl. America's youth are transforming the time around the Super Bowl into the nation's largest celebration of giving and serving through the Souper Bowl of Caring. Last year, youth across the nation collected \$10 million for charities through participating in Souper Bowl of Caring.

The Souper Bowl of Caring is a grassroots, faith-based crusade against hunger. Our youth are joining other churches, schools, organizations and individuals across the country by collecting dollars in soup pots on February 6. What is collected stays in the community. Our youth will donate what is collected to the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA).

Rev. Dr. Brad Smith, the founder of Souper Bowl of Caring, said, "It is a way for young people to put God's love into action by developing a heart for helping others. The goal is for young people to see they can make a difference and for them to continue contributing through volunteerism when they reach adulthood."

In his classic defense of the faith, he examines the evidence for the central tenets of Christianity. Retracing his own journey from atheism to belief, Strobel consults expert testimony for answers to his blunt questions as a seasoned investigative journalist. He asks, "Is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God?" "Is there credible reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?"

The Winter Stated Meeting of the Presbytery will be on February 5, 2011 at Woodlawn Presbyterian Church, 3026 Woodlawn Ave., Jacksonville, FL 32209. The featured speaker and preacher is Dr. William P. Brown, Professor of Old Testament, Columbia Theological Seminary. Dr. Brown has abiding interests in the use of scripture in the life of the church and contemporary theological discourse, as well as in the ancient cultural contexts out of which scripture emerged. Specific interests include Psalms, wisdom literature, Pentateuch, Isaiah, history of ancient Israel, and modern literary theory. Also

featured at the meeting will be a presentation of the 2011 budget and a vote on Book of Order amendments, including G-6.0106b
